Later this year, CTED will also issue an analytical brief on ways to further strengthen public private partnerships on countering the financing of terrorism .

Finally, following the adoption of the Delhi Declaration, CTED continues to work closely with the Committee to develop a set of non-binding guiding principles aimed to assist Member States to counter the use of new and emerging technologies for terrorist purposes in a holistic and comprehensive manner, in particular in the areas of ICT, terrorism financing, and unmanned aircraft systems.

In closing, I wish to reiterate support Member States, advancing our collective efforts to counter terrorism.
