



The UNDT's statement is merely an obiter dictum and does not constitute a finding of a flawed written examination in the present case.

- 18. The Secretary-General submits that the other errors alleged by Mr. Wang are equally without merit. Mr. Wang points to the select ion panel member notes to argue that the UNDT ought to have found him to be the only qualified candidate for the position. The Secretary-General submits that it was not for the UNDT to take on the substantive role with which the assessment panel was charged. MrWang merely disagrees with the final outcome but does not show how his candidature was unfairly assessed.
- 19. The Secretary-General rebuts Mr. Wang's asertion that the fact that the vacancy announcement required five years' experience showed that it was catered to the needs of


