



STATEMENT ON BEHALF OF THE GROUP OF 77 AND CHINA
BY H.E. MARCELO C. GOMES, DEPUTY PERMANENT MISSION OF THE
REPUBLIC OF ARGENTINA TO THE UNITED NATIONS, ON 10 OCTOBER 2011:
ADVANCEMENT OF WOMEN, AT THE THIRD COMMITTEE OF THE UNITED NATIONS
SESSION OF THE UNITED NATIONS GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Mr. Chairman,

Distinguished Delegates,

1. Firstly I would like to express, on behalf of the Group of 77 and China, our appreciation to the Secretary-General for the reports submitted under the agenda item
2. - In the view of the Group of 77 and China, gender equality and empowerment of women are essential for sustainable development and human rights.
3. - In this regard, the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action remains the most comprehensive and far-reaching international agreement on gender equality and human rights and the empowerment of women and girls. Since the United Nations convened the Fourth World Conference on Women in Beijing sixteen years ago, Member States with the support of the international community, including the UN system, have developed and strengthened legal frameworks that promote women's rights and enhance gender equality. Women have increasingly gained access to education, health, jobs and social safety nets.
4. - However, despite this encouraging evolution, there remain huge unmet needs among women and regions. There are still severe problems facing women, such as poverty, violence and discrimination. We recognize an urgent need for further actions at all levels to address these problems and their root causes, which include unequal access to education, health care and women as well as conflicts and socio-economic constraints.
5. - In addition to these persistent obstacles to the implementation of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action, new threats and challenges are emerging. The Group of 77 and China would like to stress the importance of addressing the ongoing impact of the global economic and financial crisis, world food crisis and continuing food insecurity, energy crisis and the challenges posed by climate change, particularly on women.
6. - The Group of 77 and China is also deeply concerned about the suffering of women and girls living under foreign occupation, and underlines the urgency for collective actions to remove the colonialist and imperialist structures.
7. - In line with the Beijing Declaration, the Group of 77 and China is convinced that women's empowerment and their full participation in all spheres of society, including the participation in the decision-making processes and access to power, are fundamental for the achievement of equality, development and peace. To this end, it is necessary to continue to foster an increasing political participation of women at all levels of decision.

2. As Member States continue to implement the Millennium Development Goals, we must recognize the contribution of progress in gender equality and empowerment of women, to these goals. In doing so, Member States must further mainstream the gender perspective in their development strategies and actions.

3. It is also important to enhance international cooperation and global partnership for achieving gender equality and empowerment for women, including the fulfilment of commitments on official development assistance, debt relief, market access, financial and technical cooperation and capacity building in particular in areas such as women's education, health and job creation in order to help eliminating gender disparities.

10. As regards the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women (UN-Women) was established by the General Assembly. The Group of 77 and China is confident that UN-Women will continue to make a relevant contribution to a world-wide promotion of gender equality and empowerment of women.

11. In closing, the Group of 77 and China affirms its commitment to the full implementation of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action, and looks forward to working together towards the further advancement of women.
